REPORT:

The II International Workshop "Motivated Behavior, Stress and Addiction: from molecules to behavior", organized by the Millennium Nucleus Stress and Addiction (NEDA) and partially supported by the ISN-CC Committee, was held in the main campus of the Universidad Técnica Federico Santa María in Valparaíso, Chile, November 15-17, 2012 (attached the Final program in document *Libro de resúmenes II workshop LARNEDA.F.pdf*).

The number of participants and assistants to the workshop was excellent, reaching a number of around 120 scientists including undergraduate and graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, young and more established researchers, from 6 different countries: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Puerto Rico, United States and Uruguay.

Over the three-days 94 different presentations were discussed in different formats:

- 5 plenary conferences:

- "Flies, sex and alcohol: how social experience affects ethanol consumption". Dr. Ulrike A. Heberlein, USA.

- "Association of drug use during adolescence, prefrontal GABAergic circuits and impulsivity". Dr. Kuei Y. Tseng, USA.

- 2 panel sessions.

A total of **76 panels** were presented by undergraduate, graduate, postdoctoral fellows and senior scientists.

All the participants had the opportunity to exchange ideas and experiences with top latin american and world scientists devoted to the addiction field. This was allowed by the friendly environment reached during the entire workshop and particularly during the inaugural cocktail, two lunches, and several coffee breaks.

This workshop also gave NEDA scientists the opportunity to interact with researchers that belong to two other organizations with whom we share common interests, the International Drug Abuse Research Society (IDARS) and the Latin American Society for Biomedical Research on Alcoholism (LASBRA). We intend to project a future work with these two organizations, something we had the opportunity to discuss during the last day of the workshop.

In particular with LASBRA we expect to organize the first of a series of Joint Meetings by October-November this year, to increase the interaction between our research groups, and hopefully to establish new collaborations.

Use of ISN-CC funds (US\$ 10,000)

Essentially the ISN-CC funds were used to support international students and postdocs to attend and participate in the Workshop.

As indicated in the invitation document submitted to several national and international organizations (please, find a copy attached entitled *instructions II Workshop.September 2012.doc*), fellowships were offered to graduated students and postdocs with the support of ISN and other sources we were able to secure, including funds from the Vice-rectory of Research of the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile and the Fund to support the formation of Scientific Networks of the Ministry of Social Development of Chile.

More than 40 students applied from countries such as Argentina, Brasil, Colombia, Puerto Rico, Uruguay and US. After evaluation of the admissibility of these applications (applications from undergraduate students or established/senior researchers did not pass this criterion), 27 were approved to be supported (please see excel file *international applicants*): 14 graduate students or postdocs from Argentina (each one received U\$600), 10 from Brasil (U\$ 800), 1 from the US (U\$500), 1 from Uruguay (U\$800). The

application of one additional grad student from the US was also approved, but she was unable to attend due to personal reasons.

The amount awarded was used by the students to pay for travel and housing costs while staying at Valparaíso, and also to pay for registration to the meeting. Registration to the meeting allowed participants to have access to the inaugural cocktail, lunches, coffee breaks and materials, which included a backpack.
