REPORT OF THE 10TH ANNUAL SCIENTIFIC MEETING OF THE NEUROSCIENCE SOCIETY OF NIGERIA HELD FROM MAY 14-17, 2012 IN CALABAR, NIGERIA

The meeting was the 10th Annual Scientific Conference of the Neuroscience Society of Nigeria (NSN), which took place from May 14-17, 2012 at the University of Calabar Conference Centre and the Planet Guest House, Calabar, Cross River State of Nigeria. The theme of the meeting was 'Harnessing Available Potentials and Materials for Neuroscience Research in Nigeria' with a sub-theme 'Neuroscience Research Collaboration for National Development'. The conference was supported in part by the International Society for Neurochemistry (ISN).

The conference had seventy (70) participants in attendance. Registration of participants marked the beginning of the meeting on May 14, 2012. Registration continued on May 15, 2012, with the opening ceremony at 10.00 am. The opening ceremony had in attendance; the Chief Host and Vice Chancellor of the University of Calabar, Prof James Epoke; Guest of Honour and Chief Medical Director of the University of Calabar Teaching Hospital, Dr Thomas Agan; Host and Deputy Provost of College of Medical Sciences, University of Calabar, Prof Ann Asuquo; Keynote Speaker, Dr Philip Njemanze, as well as, other guests and participants.

The opening ceremony began with an opening address by the Chairperson, Local Organizing Committee (LOC), Dr Theresa Ekanem. This was followed by a keynote address by Dr Philip Njemanze titled 'Harnessing Available Potentials and Materials for Neuroscience Research in Nigeria'. General speeches from the Chief Host, Deputy Provost, the Guest of Honour, and a Vote of Thanks by the Secretary, LOC, Mr Moses Ekong ended the ceremony. Highlights of the days' programme for the conference included; the first scientific sessions which was a symposium on 'Adult neurogenesis' by Prof Amadi Ihunwo, Dr Moyosore Ajao, and Dr Mathew Olude; A Plenary Talk on Herbal Application in Neuroscience by Prof Eme Osim ended the day.

May 16, 2012 featured the ISN symposium: Basic to Clinical Neurochemistry with speakers from South Africa. The speakers were Professors, Paul Manger and Laurie Kellaway. There was an IBRO Alumni symposium, and a symposium on Movement Disorders, Primary Headache, Epilepsy and Stroke. On the last day, May 17, 2012, there was a symposium on 'Bipolar, and substance use disorders. This was followed by an Annual Business Meeting which culminated in the dissolution of previous executive council and the election of a new executive council.
