5. to provide ISN with a list of all participants and to fill out the provided survey.

As organizer of a school you will receive 80% of the amount granted before the school. The residual 20% will be transferred upon receipt of the meeting report and approval by the chairperson of the ISN-Schools Initiative and the ISN Treasurer. Upon approval of an application the funds must be sent to a bank account of the applicant's institution or a designated bank account associated with the school. Transfers of funds to personal accounts are not possible.

Note that according to ISN rules, any modification in the ISN conference after ISN approval (change of date of main conference, replacement of speaker, etc.) must be approved, in advance, by the Chair of ISN-Schools Initiative Committee. If the modification is not approved, the funds will not be available, and any previously transferred money must be returned to ISN.
